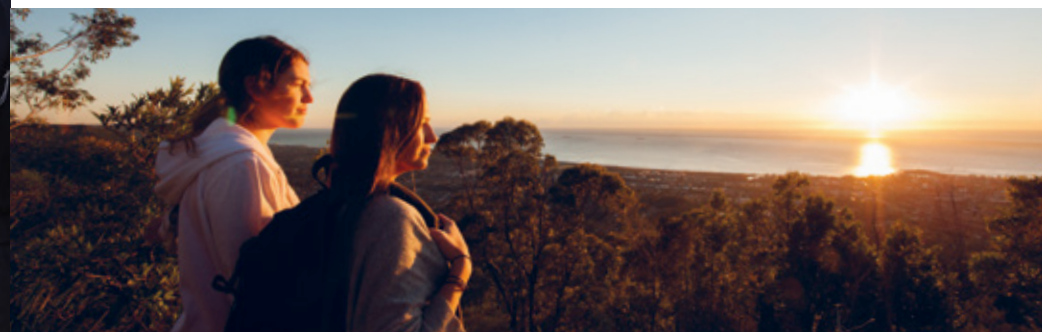

Make yourself at home

Just 90-minutes south of Sydney, Wollongong has the convenience of a big city with the ease of a small town.

GETTING AROUND

Once you arrive, your transport options around Wollongong are safe, easy and affordable.

Free buses

Wollongong is well-connected, with buses servicing the surrounding suburbs. Free 'city loop' buses run all day and into the night, making it easy to travel between campus, student accommodation, the city centre, train station and shopping district.

Train

North Wollongong Station is a 15-minute walk or short free shuttle bus ride from UOW Wollongong campus.

Bicycle

UOW Wollongong has a secure bike lock-up, showers and change rooms. Bike racks are also conveniently placed outside buildings across campus.

Walk

Most destinations in the Wollongong CBD are within easy walking distance of each other.

Car

Paid parking on campus is available.

Cost

For any public transport in and between Wollongong and Sydney, you'll never pay more than \$19.30 a day (Monday to Thursday), \$9.65 (Friday to Sunday and public holidays), or \$50 a week.¹

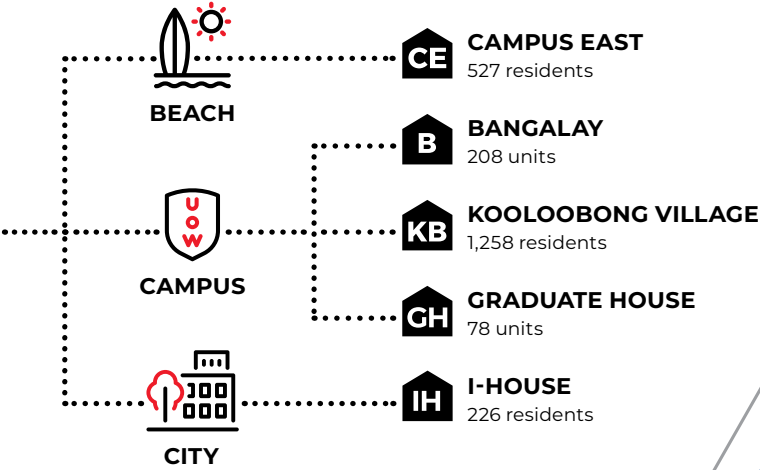

Student-based religious clubs include the Uni Bible Group, UOW International Christian Group (ICG) and the Muslim Association of Wollongong University.

STUDENT SUPPORT ADVISERS

These advisers provide support and referral services to UOW students. They also offer programs supporting student equity and diversity both within faculties and across campus. Advisers can assist you with a range of issues such as settling into the local area, study difficulties, academic concerns, budgeting, homesickness and legal issues. They can also advise on student visas, health and personal problems, family emergencies, and children's education. The service is free and confidential.

Metropolitan campuses

Liverpool campus

UOW's metropolitan campus in Liverpool offers undergraduate and postgraduate degrees. The campus provides an experience that is specially designed to meet the needs of our students.

PERSONALISED STUDY

As a UOW Liverpool student, you'll benefit from smaller class sizes and individual attention from your teachers, who are leaders in their respective fields. This is a great opportunity to meet industry leaders and learn from the best.

TRANSPORT

The campus is only a four-minute walk from Liverpool train station. The city boasts one of Sydney's first rapid bus T-way (transit way) systems, connecting you to other major areas around Sydney. The free community shuttle also stops just outside campus and is a great way to move around the CBD.

FACILITIES

In 2026, UOW Liverpool relocated to a brand new campus within Liverpool Civic Place, a hub for education, civic administration and community in the heart of South-Western Sydney. The new campus features a 5,000 sqm public library, collaborative learning spaces and a brand-new art gallery. The new campus provides everything you need to make the most of your degree including state-of-the-art cyber security labs, nursing labs, chemistry and biology labs, nutrition kitchens, recreation spaces, quiet study areas, as well as male and female prayer rooms. All of this is located within walking distance to public transport and Liverpool's shopping district.

ARTS & ENTERTAINMENT

A short train ride will lead you to Casula Powerhouse Arts Centre, a multi-disciplinary space showcasing art, live performance and music. If that's not your style, try a local karaoke bar, shopping centre, cinemas, museums or the Liverpool City Library.

FOOD

Study globally

UOW has campuses in Dubai, India, Hong Kong and Malaysia, and a presence in China and Singapore.

Our global network provides students with opportunities to access quality education delivered by UOW outside of Australia.

INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION PARTNERS

UOW has established partnerships with a number of international education institutions. These include:

- Singapore Institute of Management
- Central China Normal University Wollongong Joint Institute
- Zhengzhou University

TWINNING ARRANGEMENTS

UOW has twinning arrangements with Beijing Jiaotong University, Tiangong University and Taiyuan University of Technology (TYUT) that are formally recognised by the Chinese Ministry of Education. Students are able to complete part of their program at their home institution and then transfer to UOW to complete the remainder of their degree.

Offshore transfer discount

We encourage our students to take a global approach to their education and have established pathways between our international and Australian campuses. Students at UOW Dubai, UOW College Hong Kong, and UOW Malaysia who wish to transfer may be eligible for a **30% tuition fee reduction** for the subjects they complete onshore in Australia.

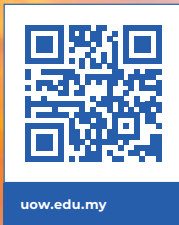

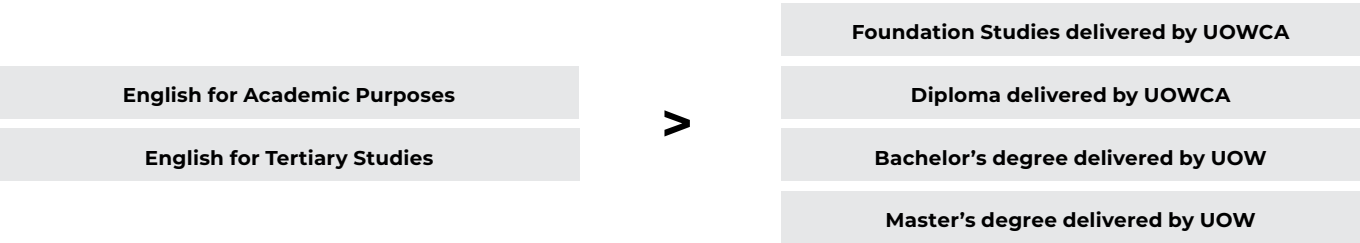

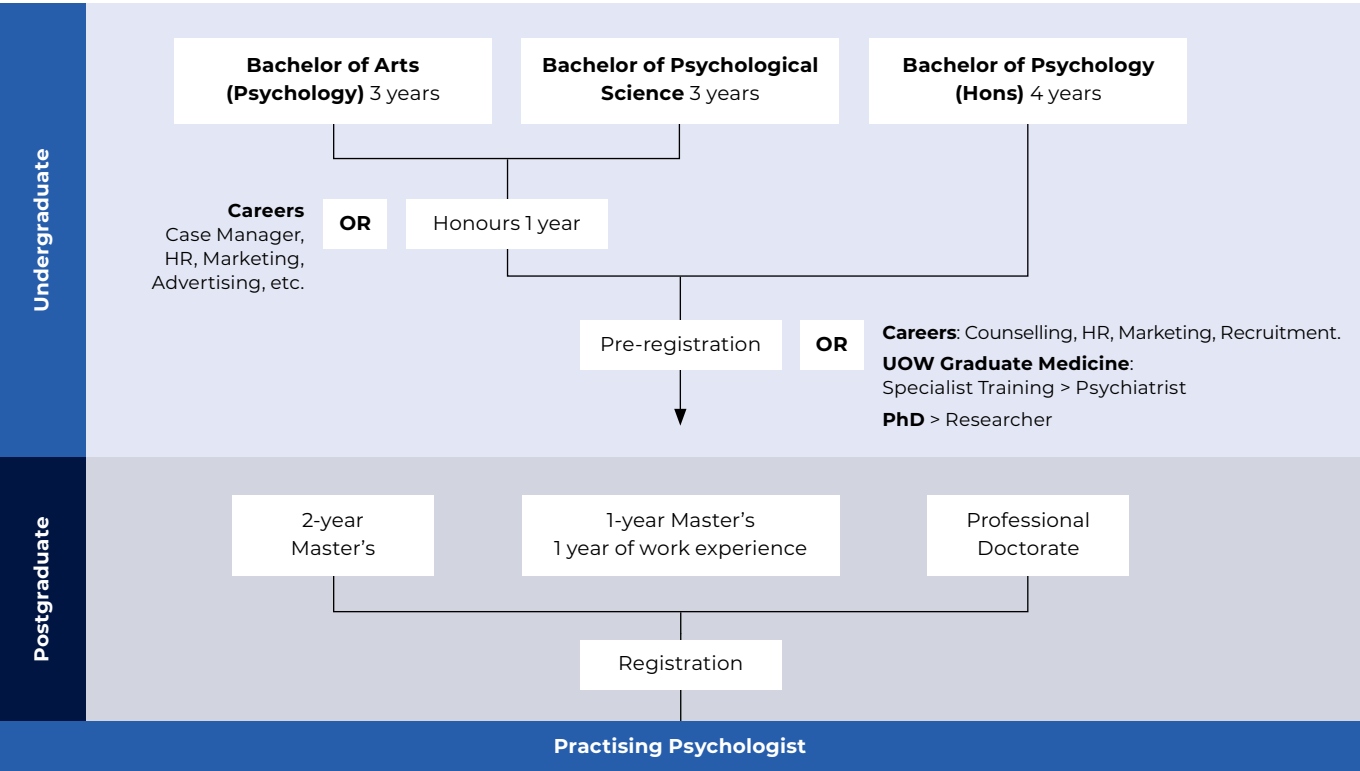

How to apply for a HDR program

Admission to a Higher Degree Research (HDR) program is competitive, and applicants must demonstrate that they can undertake higher degree research as well as identify a specific topic that fits within the research strengths of the University.

Therefore, please follow the steps below before applying for admission.

1. Find a supervisor and an academic unit

Your first step is to determine your research interests and identify a potential supervisor who matches your area of research interest.

2. Select a research topic and prepare your research proposal

Before you start writing your research proposal, we recommend discussing a broad plan for your research topic with the head of the academic unit, the faculty head of postgraduate studies or your potential supervisor.

You will need to develop a clear research proposal, summarising the topic you would like to pursue, including your proposed methodology and motivations for wanting to undertake this research.

3. Apply for admission

HDR applications can be submitted online at any time. You will need to attach supporting documentation, including your certificate of English proficiency and academic transcripts of current or previous studies. Apply online here: uow.info/HDR-apply

4. Submit additional documents with your application

Along with your application for admission, you must also provide:

- a research proposal as detailed above;
- a curriculum vitae, detailing your previous research experience and academic awards, employment history and a list of relevant publications and research roles.

As part of the application process, we may request supporting documentation such as your passport, completion certificate and transcripts for verifying your academic background, English proficiency test results, and subject description or syllabus if applying for Credit for Prior Learning (CPL).

Step 3

Submit your application and receive an acknowledgement email.

Once you have successfully submitted an application, you will receive an acknowledgement email.

Step 4

Receive an Offer of Admission and clear offer conditions to validate your offer.

If your application is successful, you will receive an Offer of Admission. Your offer may have conditions that you need to meet before you can validate your conditional offer into a full offer for acceptance.

Step 5

Accept your offer and pay your deposit to secure your place and receive your Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE).

You must submit the fee payable stated on your offer before a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) is issued to you for your student visa application.

Step 6

Apply for your student visa and plan your travel.

All international students require a valid visa to study onshore in Australia, which must be obtained before travelling to Australia.

Academic entry requirements

PATHWAY PROGRAMS AND UNDERGRADUATE COURSES

UOW and UOW College Australia recognise secondary school qualifications from over 40 countries and education systems worldwide. This includes globally recognised credentials such as GCE A Levels, International Baccalaureate (IB), ACT and SAT, as well as national high school certificates from countries including China, India, Nepal, Vietnam, and many more.

Students who have successfully completed an approved foundation studies program or postsecondary study at diploma level or higher, including diplomas from UOW College Australia, may also be considered for direct entry to undergraduate degrees.

POSTGRADUATE COURSES

UOW welcomes applications from international students with a wide range of academic and professional backgrounds. Most postgraduate programs require a recognised bachelor's degree or equivalent from an approved university. However, some programs may accept a graduate certificate or diploma, or professional experience in a relevant field.

If you don't meet the direct entry requirements, you may be eligible for a graduate certificate program as a pathway to a master's degree.

English language requirements

All applicants are required to meet the English language entry requirements^ specified for their chosen course and provide valid evidence of English proficiency.



ACCEPTED ENGLISH LANGUAGE TESTS

Results from the following internationally recognised tests are accepted:

- IELTS Academic
- LANGUAGECERT Academic Duolingo English Test
- TOEFL iBT
- Pearson PTE Academic
- Cambridge English Qualifications

Tests must be taken within two years of the course commencement date.

STUDY IN AN APPROVED ENGLISH-SPEAKING COUNTRY*

Applicants may meet the requirement if they have successfully completed one of the following qualifications in English within three years of starting their course:

- A recognised senior secondary qualification
- A recognised university foundation program with a minimum of 65% in English
- At least one year of full-time tertiary study at AQF diploma level or higher

AND the institution is located in one of the following countries:

American Samoa, Australia, Bahamas, Barbados, Botswana, Canada, Fiji, Ghana, Guyana, Ireland, Jamaica, Kenya, Lesotho, Liberia, New Zealand, Nigeria, Papua New Guinea, Samoa, Singapore, Solomon Islands, South Africa, Tonga, Trinidad & Tobago, UK, USA, Zambia, Zimbabwe.

OTHER STUDY COMPLETED IN ENGLISH*

Applicants who have successfully completed at least two years of full-time tertiary study at AQF diploma level or higher may meet the requirement if the qualification was undertaken in English within two years of the course commencement date.

An official letter from the institution confirming that English was the sole language of instruction and assessment must be provided.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE COURSES*

The English language requirement may also be satisfied by completing a direct entry English course with UOW College Australia (see page 30).

COURSE-SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS

The English requirement for each course is listed in the course description pages and is shown using IELTS Academic scores. For example:

Bachelor of Business - IELTS: 6.0 (R:6, W:6, L:5, S:5).

This means a minimum overall score of 6.0, with at least 6.0 in reading and writing, and 5.0 in listening and speaking.

Scholarships

Scholarships for international students are offered by UOW, the Australian Government and a number of international organisations.

UOW offers bursaries for undergraduate and postgraduate students from a range of countries. Bachelor's degree scholarships & bursaries

UNIVERSITY EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP

If you are commencing a bachelor's degree at UOW, you may be eligible for a 30% tuition fee waiver.

Eligibility:

Achieve excellent academic results in either your international secondary school qualification, an approved foundation studies program, or an approved diploma or academic pathway program.

Exclusions:

This scholarship is not available for students studying nutrition and dietetics, exercise science and rehabilitation, education, social work and psychology degrees. Full terms and conditions: uow.info/UES

Future leaders scholarships

UOW FUTURE LEADERS SCHOLARSHIP

Students commencing a bachelor's or master's degree have the opportunity to apply for a 100% scholarship. Only a limited number of these scholarships are available.

Eligibility:

Applicants must submit an online application before the published deadline once applications open, including the following:

- Comprehensive CV with details on extracurricular activities or leadership activities.
- Personal statement (1 page) - must address key achievements, leadership and community activities.

Exclusions:

Country scholarships & bursaries

UOW COUNTRY SCHOLARSHIPS

Country-specific scholarships support our international students to study in Australia by making world-class education more affordable. UOW has extended this offering to more diverse countries and regions that are not eligible for any other scholarship or discount. Students who receive an offer to study an eligible UOW course in 2027 from these specific regions will automatically have the 20% discount applied for the minimum duration of an eligible course.

Eligibility:

Required to be an International citizen of Bangladesh, Brazil, Cambodia, Chile, China Mainland, Colombia, Ethiopia, Ghana, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Japan, Kenya, Malaysia, Mexico, Nepal, Peru, Philippines, Singapore, South Africa, South Korea, Sri Lanka, Taiwan, Thailand, Turkey, Vietnam, Zambia and Zimbabwe.

Exclusions:

UOW country scholarships are not available for students studying a Doctor of Medicine, Nutrition and Dietetics, Exercise Physiology, Teaching, Social Work, and Psychology degrees or in conjunction with any other scholarship or discount.

Postgraduate coursework scholarships

UOW POSTGRADUATE ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP

If you are commencing your coursework postgraduate degree at UOW, you may be eligible for a 30% tuition fee waiver.

Eligibility:

To be eligible, you will need to achieve excellent academic results in an AQF-comparable bachelor's or master's degree. You must qualify as an international student and have chosen an eligible master's (coursework) degree at UOW (Australian campuses only).

Exclusions:

This scholarship is not available for students studying a Doctor of Medicine, Nutrition and Dietetics, Exercise Physiology, Teaching, Social Work, and Psychology degrees. You may not be in receipt of any other scholarship, sponsorship, bursary or discount.

UOW ALUMNI POSTGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

If you have previously completed a UOW degree, you may be eligible for a 10% tuition fee waiver.

Eligibility:

You must have completed a UOW bachelor's degree, be commencing a full-fee paying postgraduate coursework degree, and must maintain a credit average (65+) throughout your course.

Research scholarships

UOW offers a wide range of research scholarships which may be awarded to eligible International Higher Degree Research (HDR) students.

UOW HDR scholarships are in the form of allowances to assist candidates in meeting their living costs while they undertake their research. These can include annual stipends, living allowances and tuition fee costs. The main UOW scholarship schemes are the University Postgraduate Awards (UPA), Australian Government Research Training Program (AG RTP) Scholarship and the International Postgraduate Tuition Awards (IPTA).
