E-learning

E-learning plays a significant role within the university. Lectures and seminars only account for part of a course. Education is also offered through the electronic learning environment Blackboard in the form of assignments, tests, exercises, group work and question time via a forum. Our teaching staff uses Blackboard for all official communication and for the distribution of course materials.

ECTS credits

The University of Antwerp applies the 'European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System' (ECTS) in all its degree programmes.

A full-time one-year study programme amounts to 60 ECTS credits (30 ECTS credits per semester), which implies a student workload of about 1500 to 1800 hours. One ECTS credit stands for 25 to 30 hours of work including contact hours, preparatory work, study and assessment.

Higher education in Flanders

The Flemish higher education consists of 18 publicly funded higher education institutions: five universities and 13 small and medium-sized university colleges, also known as universities of applied sciences (and arts).

Higher education in Flanders has adopted the **Bachelor-Master structure**. A three-year undergraduate cycle of 180 ECTS credits leads to a Bachelor's degree and is followed by a one-year, two-year or three-year graduate cycle of 60, 120 or 180 ECTS credits leading to a Master's degree.

Advanced Master's programmes offer further specialisation in a specific field of study. A doctoral PhD degree is the highest level of specialisation in scientific research. In Belgium this degree can only be awarded by universities. For professionals who want to upgrade their knowledge and skills, we offer short-term postgraduate certificate programmes.

Student facilities

Computers and ICT

At the University of Antwerp you study in a modern learning environment. On every campus you will find computers with an internet connection, which students can use free of charge. The Student Information System Antwerp (SISA) is the digital heart of education administration at the University of Antwerp. And Blackboard, the digital learning environment, is your online compass. It not only provides you with the most up-to-date information about every course you are taking, but is also a student intranet.

Language courses

Belgium has three official languages: Dutch, French and German. Antwerp is located in the Northern part of Belgium, Flanders, where Dutch is the lingua franca. Linguapolis, the language institute of the University of Antwerp, offers intensive Dutch language courses at the beginning of each semester and during the academic year. It offers intensive courses in 13 other languages, from French and German to Chinese and Korean, and specific Academic English modules as well.




Student associations




Estimated cost of living €16 000 - €18 000 per year



Overview of the academic year

The academic year at the University of Antwerp usually starts on the last Monday of September and is split up into two semesters. Each semester comprises 13 weeks of classes followed by a 4-week examination period.

Application

International students need to submit an online **application** file with supporting documents.

Language requirements

For programmes taught in English, you need to prove your proficiency in English:

by submitting a language certificate showing your TOEFL, IELTS, ITACE or Cambridge English FCE results

by **submitting proof** you have studied at least one academic year (or 60 ECTS credits) in an English-language Bachelor's or Master's programme. Please note that the Board of Admission may require that you obtained your credits or diploma in an English-taught programme in Australia, English-speaking Canada, Ireland, New Zealand, the United Kingdom or the United States of America before you are exempted from providing a language test certificate.

Applicants for the English-taught Bachelor's programme Social-Economic Sciences should check the language requirements on the programme's website.

Acceptance

After your application has been approved, you will be sent an official Letter of Acceptance.

Do you have a Chinese degree?

If you want to come to Belgium to study and you have a Chinese degree, you will have to go through a mandatory academic screening, called Akademische Prüfstelle (APS). The screening is done by the German Embassy in Beijing and consists of two parts: a formal check of the diploma and an interview with the student to test their academic knowledge. Upon a successful screening you will get an APS certificate.

The screening can take **several months**. We recommend to start the procedure on time and to contact the Academic Evaluation Centre in Beijing as soon as possible.

Student visa

If you are a national of an EEA country, Monaco or Switzerland, you may travel to Belgium on the strength of your national passport or identity card.

If you have any other nationality, you need to apply for a **student visa type D** at the Belgian embassy or consulate in your current country of residence before leaving for Belgium.

If you have dual citizenship (e.g. non-EU and EU) and you are currently not a resident of an EU country, we strongly advise you to apply for a student visa.
